WHY is this information packet important?

It's a parent's worst nightmare! Your child goes missing. Time is of the essence. In the event of an emergency, you will be better prepared if you have carefully completed this packet. Having your child/ren's information ready, available and updated for police officials will eliminate the need for many questions and help save valuable time in starting an investigation.

This Emergency Child Identification Packet Includes:

Child Personal Information: This packet has pages to record the most up-to-date emergency identification information about your child/ren.

Photo ID: This packet includes spaces to keep your child/ren's most recent and past identifying photographs.

DNA Identification: This packet includes a space for your child/ren's hair to be attached for DNA identification purposes.

Fingerprint Identification: This packet includes information about getting your child/ren fingerprinted.

CHILD/REN PERSONAL INFORMATION SHEET

The value of ready information means the difference of having time wasted, compared to having an investigation starting immediately. By completing the personal information you are creating a tremendous time-saving tool and taking the first step in being prepared.

Helpful Hints:

- Complete all fields carefully and completely. It will only take a few minutes.

- Update child personal information every time the photo is updated.

- Know where your child/ren's medical and dental records are located.

- Keep this completed packet in a safe but easily accessible place.

- Update this packet regularly.

- If there is any additional information that you feel would be important to an investigation, we encourage that you include that information with this packet.

- By completing the Child Personal Information Page you are now taking another step in the protection of your child.

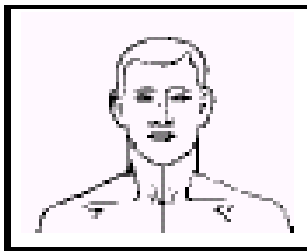

PHOTO INFORMATION SHEET

Photographs are very important in bringing children home!

- A photo of your child should be **UPDATED EVERY FOUR TO SIX MONTHS** and placed in this packet along with their updated height and weight records.
- The photo can be any size but must have certain poses for viewing purposes.
- The photo must have a clear crisp shot of your child/ren's facial features.
- It is recommended that you take the photo with a 35mm or Polaroid camera for best quality.
- Digital cameras are acceptable only if there is no distortion with the image. Also, digital photos must be printed, as well as on a disk.
- The two images below are acceptable poses for identification purposes.
- Be sure to include clothed full body poses in your photos as well.

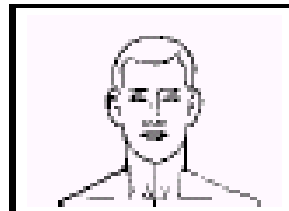

DNA IDENTIFICATION

To collect a hair sample, simply brush or comb your child's hair and use the remaining hair from the brush/comb. The root of the hair contains the DNA information. **The hair sample MUST contain the root or follicle of the hair.** After the hair has been collected, place the sample in a plain white piece of paper and then put it in a plastic baggie and tape it to the space below

FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION

Fingerprint Identification is a very useful tool in the identification of your child. To get fingerprints taken, call your local police department to schedule a time. Police are trained to make sure the fingerprints are of useful quality – home finger print kits can not always be trusted. Good fingerprints of your child only need to be taken once, but they must be taken and stored correctly in order to be useful for identification purposes.

- 6. Trust your feelings and talk to grown-ups about your problems.**
- 7. It's never too late to ask for help. You are not alone.**
